


Marine Rescue WA Training Program









Training Program Entry

Training Programs are a role-based training framework designed for progressive and safe training.

As a volunteer, you will be placed on the Marine Rescue Member Training Program on eAcademy before you can commence any training. This applies to all new and current volunteers engaging in training with DFES.

You will be notified via email when your application is approved and confirmed. The Training Program will then appear on your eAcademy record.

Prerequisite Requirements

You will automatically be enrolled on the Marine Rescue Member Training Program once you have completed a Volunteer Membership Application and have a DFES Volunteer Number.

Completion Requirements

To complete the Marine Rescue Member Training Program, you need to complete all the training courses listed on the Training Program.

Training Programs Progress - Next Steps

Once you have completed the Marine Rescue Member Training Program, you will be automatically enrolled on the following Marine Rescue Training Programs:

- Shore Based Radio Operator and/or
- Marine Rescue Crew

You can be registered on more than one Training Program at any one time, if they are relevant to your role/s.

Once you have completed the Marine Rescue Crew Training Program, you will be automatically enrolled on the Marine Rescue Senior Crew Training Program. Volunteers with existing commercial marine qualifications may apply for Recognition of Current Competencies (RCC), see below.

Transition from grandfathered Rescue Skipper (Restricted) Training Program to Rescue Skipper Training Program

Some volunteers may have been grandfathered up to the Rescue Skipper (Restricted) Training Program and wish to progress to Rescue Skipper Training Program, even though they have not actually completed any of the DFES training courses up to Rescue Skipper (Restricted) level.

Volunteers in this situation, will need to enrol and complete the three (3) courses held within the Rescue Skipper Training program.

Any volunteers wishing to complete this process should speak with their Training Officer, Group Commander or relevant District Officer Marine.

To complete the Rescue Skipper Training Program, you need to complete all the training courses that are listed as being required on the Training Program.

Training Programs Progress – Next Steps

Rescue Skipper is currently the final, highest level Marine Rescue Training Program. However, with the appropriate approvals, additional courses from the Training Programs Specialist Courses Catalogue may be accessed if they are relevant and will contribute to the effective performance of your Marine Rescue role. Your Group Supervisor or *District Officer Marine* will be able to assist you with this.

Associated Roles

When you have completed this Training Program, you will have the skills and competencies required to perform the Marine Rescue Skipper role enabling you to operate a suitable Marine Rescue vessel within 30nm of the TSB – baseline.

The recommended timeframe for completing this Training Program is 2 years.
